NOTE:

ALL BAF STUDENTS:

- To be eligible for SEMESTER 4, students must successfully complete EAC 150
- To be eligible for SEMESTER 5, students must obtain a minimum grade of C in FIS 403 and EAC 394 and a grade of B in RFC 121
- ALL BAF students must take 3 Liberal Studies Electives, and at least one of these must be a literature option - these electives begin with an EAC or SES code.
- ECN550 is not considered a Liberal Studies Elective in this program
- University graduates with an accounting / finance / economics major AND a GPA of 2.7 or higher may be eligible for entry into SEMESTER 5 of the BAF program
- Students with an assessment score indicating a requirement for remedial math, should take QNM 103 in Semester 1 and QNM 104 in Semester 2 (QNM 103 + QNM 104 = QNM 106)

Non Co-op Students:

- To be eligible for SEMESTER 5, students may have no more than 3 courses remaining for completion from semesters 1-4 AND must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.7

Co-op Students:

- To be eligible for SEMESTER 5, students must complete ALL subjects from semesters 1-4 AND must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 or better
